PREFACE

The Managing Committee of Rambhau Mhalgi Prabodhini is delighted to present the report of the activities conducted in 2017-2018. It is 36 years since the institution was established. We take pride in sharing that Prabodhini, which began in a small office at Chanchal Smruti, Wadala, Mumbai is now also organising events of international importance and recognition. This has not been a sudden development; it is the culmination of a number of factors viz. the leadership of stalwarts like Late Uttamrao Patil, Late Pramod Mahajan, Late Vasantrao Patwardhan, Late Gopinath Munde; the incessant hard work of the Prabodhini staff and volunteers, the creative vision of Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, the co-operation of well-wishers of Prabodhini and guidance from the office bearers of Rashtriya Swayamsewak Sangh and BJP.

Some of the significant milestones in the progress of the Prabodhini are: The Programme Department which became functional from 1990, enriching awareness and training by bringing in the research dimension; the Prabodhini Complex created at Keshav Srushti, Uttan in 2000; and the conferment of the special voluntary organisation status by the United Nations in 2006. The unique features of Prabodhini initiatives have been innovation, creativity and participatory training in order to give professionalism a human touch; these values have inspired the Prabodhini's initiatives during this year as well.

1. SPECIAL PROGRAMMES

1.1 Economic Democracy Conclave (14th January 2018)

RMP organised Economic Democracy Conclave on January 14, 2018. In this conclave, the Hon'ble President of India Shri Ramnath Kovind was invited as the Chief Guest. He addressed the gathering of over 200 young entrepreneurs and urged the entrepreneurs, "Do not choose self-employment due to frustration at the non-availability of employment; even if you have to give up employment opportunities, start your own business ventures, take advantage of the various opportunities to become employers yourselves. Become the hands that give employment rather than asking for it." Other dignitaries present were Hon'ble First Lady of India Savita Kovind, Hon. Governor of Maharashtra C. Vidyasagar Rao, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra Devendra Fadnavis, Hon'ble Minister of State for Finance Shiv Pratap Shukla, Chairman of RMP Prof. Aniruddha Deshpande, Vice-Chairman of RMP & National Vice President of BJP Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Founder Chairman of Dalit Indian Chamber of Commerce and Industry (DICCI) Milind Kamble, Chairman NABARD Harsh Kumar and Executive Director RMP Ravindra Sathe.

200 successful young entrepreneurs from Thane, Palghar, Mumbai (Suburban) and Navi Mumbai districts who are beneficiaries of various schemes like the Mudra Yojana, Dalit Venture Capital Scheme and Start-up Scheme participated in the conference. The President, in his address also emphasised that encouraging entrepreneurship is not solely the responsibility of the government; institutions, private banks, business groups, NGOs and the media need to contribute towards creating an atmosphere that nurtures entrepreneurship. The President displayed a touch of fondness on his first visit to the Prabodhini after ascending to the Presidential chair. He re-lived some vivid memories while addressing the audience. He said, "I have visited the Prabodhini 10-12 times in the past, as a trainee as well as a trainer on various subjects. As a participant like yourselves, I have received training from Late Pramod Mahajan, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe. Visiting the campus today as the President has rekindled a number of fond memories. I remember every part of the campus I visited and the knowledge I gained here." His heartfelt statement received applause from the audience. Through his address, Hon. Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, traced the development of the state of Maharashtra. During the inaugural session, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe made a prefatory speech and Prof. Deshpande proposed the vote of thanks.

The first session was titled 'Economic Democracy: Opportunities and Aspirations.' The resource persons for the session were Manish Kumar, CEO, National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), Milind Kamble, President, DICCI, A. K. Kapoor, Executive Director, CBD and Prasad Dahapute, Executive Director, Varhad Capital. Sampatiya Uike, Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) from Madhya Pradesh chaired this session.

The second session centered around 'Marketing, Innovative Projects, and Market Achievements'. Vinai Kumar Saxena, Chairman, Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) chaired this session. Prof. Harsh Verma, Delhi University and Sanjay Tripathy, Co-founder and CEO Agilio were the resource persons.



The afternoon saw two parallel sessions being conducted. The theme of the first one was 'Finance and Loans' while the second session was about 'Consultants, Networking and Challenges of Training'. The session on 'Finance and Loans' was chaired by an expert economist, Syed Zafar Islam. The resource persons were P. C. Panigrahi, General Manager of Union Bank, Anil Sawant, Chief District Manager and Ashish Aggarwal, CEO, Talento Consulting. The session on 'Consultants, Networking and Challenges of Training' was chaired by Dr. P. Shekhar, Chairman, Microtech Global Foundation and Member, FICCI. The resource persons were Vaishali Aparajit from DeAsra and Banuchandar Nagarajan, Technical Advisor to the Human Resource Development Minister, among others.

The Chief Guests for the Valedictory Session of the Conference were Hon. Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh Pema Khandu and Hon'ble Minister of State for Finance Shiv Pratap Shukla. Other dignitaries like H.R. Dave, Deputy Managing Director of NABARD; Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Ravindra Sathe, Executive Director of RMP also graced the occasion.

1.2 One Nation One Election (20th, 21st January 2018)

Our Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi had recently called an all-party meet to discuss One Nation One Election for India. In that backdrop on 20th and 21st January 2018 RMP hosted a National Seminar to discuss this subject. This seminar was held at RMP's Knowledge Excellence Centre and was inaugurated by Dr. Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog. Professor V.K. Malhotra, Member Secretary, Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi, Dr Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Rekha Mahajan, Member, Managing Committee, RMP, Arvind Rege, Member, Managing Committee, RMP and Ravindra Sathe Executive Director RMP were also present during the ceremony. The seminar was attended by 250 delegates from different professional backgrounds, like Academicians, Politicians, Journalists, Bloggers, Research Scholars, Senior Professors and Citizens who want to contribute in churning this idea. While giving his Keynote Address Dr. Sahasrabuddhe mentioned that every year elections are held at multiple locations in India which consumes a lot of national resources. It is hence very important that a national debate on the issue is ignited. Dr. Rajiv Kumar in his speech mentioned that if our citizens opt for One Nation One Election then it will save the country a lot of money in terms of expenditure and this money can be used for many development projects and creation of basic facilities for the people. Sessions were conducted on topics of Hazards of Multiplicity of Election, Simultaneous Elections: Concept, advisability and implementation, An overview, No-Confidence; Dissolution of houses related issues and solutions, Simultaneous Elections: Experiences abroad and Simultaneous elections: How Politicians think? Other learned speakers and eminent panellists were Shakti Sinha, Director, Nehru Memorial Museum and Library (NMML), Shri Manoj Agarwal, Founder, People for Nation, Prof S.P. Singh, Delhi University, Dr. Himanshu Roy, Delhi University, Prof. I. Ramabrahmam, Department of Political Science & Honorary Director, Academic Staff College University of Hyderabad, Prof E Vayunandan, Vice Chancellor, Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Adv. Uday Warunjikar, Constitutional Expert), Justice V.S Kokje, Former Governor of Himachal Pradesh, Jagdeep S. Chhokar, Founder, Association of Democratic reforms, Yashwant Deshmukh, MD and Chief Editor, CVOTER, Prof S K Singh, Professor, Gautam Buddha University, Prof Amita Singh, Professor, JNU. Last session was chaired by Chief Minister Haryana Manohar Lal Khattar.



Dr Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Dr Baijayant Panda, MP, Lok Sabha, K.C. Tyagi, MP, Rajya Sabha were also present. This session was moderated by Kailashnath Adhikari, Managing Director, Governance Now. Valedictory Session was attended by Manohar Lal Khattar, Subhash Kashyap, Eminent Constitutional Expert, Dolly Sunny, Hon'ble Director WRC, ICSSR, Dr Vinay Sahasrabuddhe and Ravindra Sathe.

1.3 International Conference and Convention of Representatives of Ancient Cultures (1st - 4th February 2018)

The sixth International Conference and Convention of Representatives of Ancient Cultures was organised at the Knowledge Excellence Centre (KEC) under the aegis of the International Cultural Studies Centre (ICSC) from 1st to 4th February 2018. 250 representatives from 32 countries representing 25 ancient cultures participated in the convention, wearing their traditional dress. The International Cultural Studies Centre was established in 1997 to promote world peace and to nurture the close relationships between ethnic groups in Africa, Australia, Europe, North America, South America and South-East Asia. The convention was aimed at providing a common platform to various ancient cultures from all over the world. The central theme for this year was exploring divinity through the feminine form. Through films and presentations, the role of women vis-a-vis divinity and various initiatives were discussed during the sessions. The convention was conducted in the Prabodhini campus for the second time. The first convention had been conducted at the Knowledge Excellence Centre in 2003. Shri. Bhaiyyaji Joshi, General Secretary, RSS and Shri Dattatreya Hosabale, Joint General Secretary, RSS along with intellectuals from various countries participated in the convention. Volunteers of RSS International Wing, Shekhar Patel, Saumitra Gokhale, Shyam Parande and Anil Vartak put in a lot of efforts to make the convention a success.

1.4 Digital School: State-level Motivational Gatherings (2nd May 2017)

After creating Digital Schools in 1103 schools of Zilla Parishad in Dhule district, Mhalgi Prabodhini activist Harshal Vibhandik organised motivational gatherings in 22 districts and on 36 locations in Maharashtra. In these gatherings, the Zilla Pairshad school teachers and Gram Parishad sevaks were explained in detail the importance of having Digital Schools. It was also explained that how Digital Schools would enhance the education in rural areas and what they would need to do to get financial assistance for the same. A state level motivation gathering was organized to encourage all Zilla Parishads in Maharashtra on 2 May 2017 at the RMP KEC Center.

Upto April 2017 all the districts in Maharashtra and their Zilla Pairshad schools who had enabled Digital Schools facilities were felicitated by the Maharashtra Hon'ble Governor C. Vidyasagar Rao and Hon'ble Education Minister Vinod Tawde. Zilla Parishads of Dhule, Gondiya, Hingoli and Thane were able to achieve hundred percent Digital Schools and they were commended. A similar Motivational gathering was later also organized in New Jersey by Harshal Vibhandik with help of NRIs. Vinod Tawde, Education Minister, Government of Maharashtra was also present via Video Conference and interacted with all the participants at this gathering.



1.5 Deendayal Katha (24th, 25th September 2017)

Deendayal Katha was organised on 24th and 25th September 2017 under the joint aegis of RMP, Mumbai, Deendayal Research Institute (DRI), Delhi and the Cultural Department of the Central Government. The programme was organised to commemorate the birth centenary year of Late Deendayal Upadhyay and was held at Terapanth Bhavan Hall, Thakur Complex, Kandivali (East). Adv. Alok Kumar, Sah-Sanghchalak of the Delhi region of RSS presented the programme based on the life-story of Late Deendayal Upadhyay. Bharat Pathak, Vice President of DRI made a prefatory speech while the guests were welcomed by Arvind Rege, Member, Managing Committee, RMP. On 24th September, Bharat Pathak narrated the life-story of Deendayalji in his vivid style. Later Adv. Alok Kumar brought the life-story of Deendayalji alive for the audience through his evocative narration. On the second day, Adv. Alok Kumar elucidated the social philosophy of Deendayalji i.e. Ekatma Manav Darshan. The two-day Katha series was concluded by guidance from Bhayyaji Joshi, General Secretary, RSS. The programme was successful because of the support from the local BJP MLA Atul Bhatkhalkar and his associates, RSS and allied organisations.

1.6 National Conference on 'Women at the Centre of the Decision –Making Process: Realities and Future' (26th, 27th October 2017)

This National Conference had been organised on 26th and 27th October 2017 at Pune to mark the Birth Centenary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay, the propagator of Ekatma Manav Darshan. The national conference was jointly organised by RMP, Drishti Stree Adhyayan Prabodhan Kendra, Pune, Deendayal Research Institute, Delhi and the Cultural Ministry of the Government of India.

145 women representatives of 52 different NGOs which are actively working for women's development in 8 states of India participated in this conference. Prof. Aniruddha Deshpande, Chairman, RMP inaugurated the Conference. He spoke about the dismal reality that neither the social conditions nor the social attitude considers women as the center of decision-making. Nirmalatai Apte, Founder, Bharatiya Stree Shakti, delivered the keynote address of the Conference. In her address, she discussed women's rights all over the world, the struggles for women's rights and their impact on Indian women. The first session was on the theme 'Woman-Centred Family System'. General Secretary of Rashtriya Sevika Samiti, Sita Akaa Chaired the session. The resource persons were Ragini Chandratre, President, Maharashtra Region, Bharatiya Stree Shakti; Senior advocate, Monika Arora, Delhi and Senior advocate Jai Vaidya from Mumbai. In her concluding remarks, Sitakka stated that woman's inherent qualities are being ignored today, which has led to contemporary issues. She recommended that NGOs tackle these issues by giving proper guidance to women.

The second session titled 'Women-Centered Institutional Life' was chaired by Dr. Vasudha Kamat, former Vice-Chancellor, SNDT Women's University. The resource persons were Dr. Jyoti Chauthaiwale, social activist, New Delhi, Dr. Divya Gupta, Jwala Sanstha, Indore and Rashmi Shukla, Commissioner of Police, Pune City. As more and more women enter into management, the scenario will slowly change, however there is a lack of faith in women's capabilities, resulting in a low number of women in top management positions, stated Dr. Vasudha Kamat.



The third session on 'Women-Centered Social Life' was chaired by Nirupama Deshpande, Founder, Sampoorna Bamboo Kendra, Amravati. The resource persons Dr. Nahid Shaikh, Social activist, Ratnagiri, Pratibha Phatak, Aurangabad and Shatabdi Pande, President, Chhatisgarh Mahila Manch shared their experiences and underlined the important role of women in social life.

The fourth session titled 'Women and Political Power' was chaired by Dr. Poornima Advani, former Chairperson, National Commission for Women. The resource persons were Vijaya Rahatkar, Chairperson, Maharashtra State Commission for Women, Bhim Raskar, Social worker, Mumbai and Dr. Neelam Gorhe, Spokesperson of Shivsena.

The valedictory session of this two-day National Conference was chaired by Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe. He stated that putting women at the centre of decision-making does not imply that men be side-lined, but that both men and women receive equal opportunities. He stated that a study of the patriarchal mind-set is also necessary. Archana Chitnis, Hon. Minister for Public Relations, Madhya Pradesh was the Chief Guest for the session. She shared her own experiences as a woman minister with the participants. Anjali Deshpande, Secretary, Drishti Stree Adhyayan Prabodhan Kendra delivered the prefatory speech for the conference and the vote of thanks was proposed by Ravindra Sathe, Executive Director of RMP. The proceedings concluded with the singing of Sampoorna Vande Mataram.

1.7 Samwad Sabha (Editors, Publishers, Journalists and Writers Meet) (10th, 11th June 2017)

RMP has been organising Samwad Sabha since the past four years to provide a platform for editors, publishers, journalists and writers. This year's Samwad Sabha was organised on 10th and 11th June 2017. 49 renowned persons from the fields of literature, publishing, and journalism participated in the discussion which was held in the Knowledge Excellence Centre complex. The discussion was inaugurated by Vikas Paranjape, Jyotsna Prakashan, Ragini Pundalik and Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe.

The programme began with a seminar on the theme 'Journalism today: Realities and Challenges'. Ambarish Mishra, Rajiv Khandekar, Sarang Darshane and Meghana Dhoke participated in the seminar. Prof. Keshav Paranjpe, through his presentation titled 'An appreciation of selected renditions of the singer Kishoritai Amonkar' presented information about Kishoritai's dazzling contribution to music and the journey of her spiritual development through music from 1955 to 2000. The seminar on the 'Writing Style of Talwalkar' was conducted by Girish Kuber, Prakash Akolkar and Meena Vaishampayan. Ram Jagtap, Prachi Sathe and Vivek Govilkar discussed 'Concerns regarding Marathi language' in this seminar, the importance of expert opinion on the issue was stressed. Madhukar Dharmapurikar and Prashant Kulkarni explained the deeper meaning behind Social cartoons by displaying clippings of the same. Their presentation demonstrated how effectively a cartoonist can communicate through a single cartoon.

An Exhibition of the books authored by the master of writing style Govind Talwalkar was also organised as part of the programme. The two-day Samwad Sabha was a great success with friendly and fruitful discussions. Within only four years, it has become an intellectual gathering to reckon with. Eminent participants noted that these discussions, held in green surroundings, stimulate editors, journalists, publishers and writers to shape public opinion.



1.8 Study Trip to China of Shri Ravindra Sathe (31st December 2017 - 4th January 2018)

Ravindra Sathe, Executive Director, RMP was invited for a study tour of Tsian Yang and Haiku in China from 31st December 2017 to 4th January 2018 by China's Hainan Institute for World Watch. This institute studies the political and social developments in South East Asia. Sathe addressed the young Chinese researchers about party politics in India and the training of youth by political parties. He also informed the participants about the 9-month leadership training course for aspiring politicians organised by the IIDL. The Chinese participants expressed their interest in the course. Sathe also interacted with the professors and researchers at Tsian Minzu University.

2. TRAINING:

2.1 Social Awareness Camp (21st - 28th May 2017)

Hon'ble Prime Minister Narendra Modi has appealed to the youth to utilise their vacations for learning new subjects and new technology. Against this background, RMP had organised an eight-day Social awareness camp with the motto 'I am New India'. During this eight-day camp, students were introduced to eight new skills.

21 youngsters in the age group of 16 to 28 years, coming from 6 different districts of Maharashtra participated in the 'I am New India Social Awareness Camp'. They included students of Class X, students of technical schools and students of media studies. The camp was inaugurated by renowned social worker for rural development in Maharashtra, Popatrao Pawar, Sarpanch of Hiware Bazar. He appealed to the students to keenly observe the changes in the natural world around them. The camp comprised of sessions on wide ranging topics like Changing India, National Unity, The History of Social Reform in Maharashtra, Gender Equality, Idealism and Reality, Issues and Paradoxes in Social Media, Indian Laws, Friendship in the age of Social Media. Experts Aditya Pathak, Prof. Avinash Kolhe, Dr. Suvarna Rawal, Ragini Chandratre, Shefali Vaidya, Adv. Ashish Chavan and Dr. Swapna Patkar were resource persons for the camp.

The camp also included sessions on life skills like: How to Make Friends, Conversational Skills, Group Discussions, Film Review, Survey and Research, Business Management and Preparing a Resume. Ravindra Sathe, Mandar Bharade, Shashikant Sawant, Yashwant Thakar, Sandip Singh, Milind Chalke and Devendra Pai guided the participants. In addition to this, the sessions on Knights of Social Change included sessions by Jyoti Patkar (on Human Trafficking), Vijay Jadhav (on Children living on Railway Platforms), Vidyadhar Walawalkar (on Hospital Waste Management) and Vivek Atre. These sessions encouraged the participants to develop a new perspective on social issues.

The session on Entrepreneurship and Business was conducted by Devendra Pai. Participants learned about new arenas of business from Shakti Salgaonkar, Director, Kalnirnay, Sandesh Bhat, CEO, Suyog Natya Sanstha, Tejas Lomte, Entrepreneur, Verita Technology and Prathamesh Sawant, Hair Stylist. The third session focused on National Security. Experts from the Forum for Integrated National Security (FINS) Col. Tripathi, Capt. Smita Gaikwad, Researcher, Gopal Dhok, Researcher explained to the participants the internal and external security challenges faced by the nation. They also guided the participants on how to deal with these challenges.



2.2 Public Speaking and Communication Skills Training Camp (5th, 6th August 2017)

This Camp was organised under the joint-aegis of RMP and Astitva Social Foundation, Nashik on 5th and 6th August 2017 at Hotel Big City, Gangapur Road, Nashik. 24 representatives (13 male and 11 female) from Nashik city and the surrounding districts participated in the camp. The inaugural ceremony was graced by the presence of Nitin Dada More of Bal Sanskar Kendra and Suvarna Kothawde of Astitva Social Foundation. Eminent experts like Dr. Ramdas Gujarathi, Ravindra Sathe, Rajendra Patankar, Announcer on Aakashwani, Pramod Pawar, Senior Theatre Artist and Prof. Dilip Phadke enlightened the participants about Reading and Diligence, Conversational Skills, Body Language, Compeering, Phonetics and Voice Culture and Public Speaking. After these sessions, the participants presented demonstrations of the skills which were recorded and detailed feedback was given by Prof. Phadke, highlighting the strengths and weaknesses of each participant and providing suggestions on improvement. Participants expressed their feedback about the camp.

2.3 Antyodaya Dishadarshan Camp (29th, 30th and 31st March 2018)

Since this year is the Birth Centenary Year of Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay, RMP had organised a number of programmes to commemorate the occasion. Many schemes of the Central Government are being implemented with the basic principle of benefitting the downtrodden in society. Against this backdrop, RMP organised the Antyodaya Dishadarshan Camp in association with the Department of Culture, Government of India. The camp focused on the representatives of NGOs that are active in various fields all over India. The camp was inaugurated through a keynote speech delivered by Dr. Mahesh Chandra Sharma, Senior Researcher and philosopher. Other dignitaries present were Bhikuji (Dada) Idate, Senior RSS activist; Arvind Rege, Member, Managing Committee, RMP and Ravindra Sathe. In his speech, Dr. Sharma pointed out that the current social unhappiness is rooted in economic, social and intellectual disparity. The upliftment of Indian society is possible only through Antyodaya. Antyodaya is an effort to bring development to the poorest of the poor and to attempt to raise their standard of living. Deendayalji had studied the upliftment of the poor in great depth. The structure of the Indian economy is traditional, as are the social relationships. Despite its numerous flaws, Indian society is fundamentally based on inter-relationships. It is unchanging and eternal, stated Dr. Sharma.

122 representatives of various NGOs from 13 states participated in the camp. On the first day of the three-day camp, Dr. Sharma addressed the audience in a session on 'Antyodaya in the context of Liberalisation, Globalisation and Privatisation'. He expressed his thoughts on the globalisation policy of America and the European nations. These nations are imposing globalization on the world economy in order to gain power through new markets. Their goal is to throttle the indigenous production by replacing it with their products and hence their attempt to increase the purchasing power of every individual. He further said that Indian lifestyle incorporates the four elements of individual, community, nature and metaphysics and that the essence of Ekatma Manawtawaad (Integral Humanism) is the multidimensional development of humankind. Thus, Antyodaya is the key to the development of the poor and a method for minimizing the ill effects of globalisation.

4 PUBLIC AWAKENING:

4.1 Antyodaya Awards 2018 (26th March 2018)

The Antyodaya Award instituted by RMP and sponsored by Balasaheb Gokhale and Shyamala Gokhale Trust, Mumbai was awarded to Varsha Parchure, Parivartan Mahila Sanstha during a programme held on 26th March 2018.

Antyodaya Award is being presented since 2000 to a person who, through an NGO, makes a significant contribution towards upliftment of the downtrodden. This year, the award was presented to Varsha Parchure, who has been living among tribals in the remote area of Mokhada taluka, Palghar district for many years and working towards their upliftment.

The award was presented by Dr. Neelam Gorhe, senior social activist, while Dr. Satish Modh, Sanghchalak, Konkan region, RSS was the chairperson.

Ravindra Sathe, Executive Director of RMP explained the background of the award. In her award acceptance speech, Varsha Parchure described the huge amount of efforts needed to be put in for long-term empowerment of the women in Mokhada. The development work is in progress in 100 Pattas (settlements) of 10 villages. She stated that their work was in the initial stage and that this award would add to their enthusiasm. The Chief Guest, Dr. Neelam Gorhe, Founder, Stree Aadhar Kendra, Pune, stated that it is important to distinguish between means and ends. If the goal is worthy, the work is naturally constructive. The work done by Varsha Parchure through Parivartan Sanstha is thus commendable, added Dr Gorhe.

Chairperson Dr. Satish Modh expressed his desire for more and more such work. He stated that, social work can create 40% jobs and thus help in generating employment at a fast pace. Development work can be carried out more effectively by women and therefore it is important to create an atmosphere where women can work without fear. Chanda Gokhale from Gokhale Trust proposed the vote of thanks. The programme concluded with a recitation of Sampoorna Pasaydan.



4.2 Swatantryaveer Savarkar Memorial Inter-Collegiate Debate Competition (10th September 2017)

The Swatantryaveer Savarkar Memorial Inter College Debate Competition jointly organised by RMP and Savarkar Darshan Pratishthan, Mumbai was held at Bhave Primary School, Sadashiv Peth, Pune. This was the 13th successful year of this competition. 18 teams (a total of 36 participants) from colleges in various parts of Maharashtra participated in the competition. The topic assigned to them for debate was 'Will the Indo-Israel Friendship Hamper India's Ties with Arab Nations?'

The topic was designed to promote critical thinking about India's role in international relation, and it required the participants to study and research the issue. The response of students was overwhelming. College students from Pune, Nashik, Virar, Bhayandar, Thane, Jaisinghpur and Islampur participated in the competition. The competition was very close, with the team from ILS Law College, Pune bagging the first prize. The team from Government Engineering College, Pune, won the second prize. Mahesh Gadade of ILS Law College, Nachiket Panse of Government Engineering College, Pune and Susharad Deshpande of Modern College respectively won the top three individual prizes.

Eminent journalists Ravikiran Sane, Niranjan Agashe and News reader Swati Mahalank were the judges for the competition. The prize winners were felicitated on the same day by senior journalist Vijay Kuwalekar. "To become a good orator, one must read a lot, listen to speeches by others and prepare well before delivering a speech. You can become a good orator only if you identify apt material from proper reference books rather than merely cut-pasting from the internet." This was the valuable advice given by V. Kuwalekar.

4.3 Hindutva Study (Introduction) Certificate Course (9th - 11th March 2018)

Hindutva Study Certificate Course was jointly organised by RMP and Savarkar Darshan Pratishthan on 9th, 10th, 11th March 2018 at the Knowledge Excellence Centre, Uttan, Bhayandar. 5. RESEARCH

Vastav Darshan Fellowship: Bamboo Cultivation in Konkan

11. CENTRE FOR INSTITUTION BUILDING AND LEADERSHIP STUDIES, PUNE:

The details of the various programmes organised by the Centre are as follows:

11.1 Women's Self-Help Groups and Entrepreneurship Development Workshop (17th, 18th June 2017)

Self-help groups and entrepreneurship development play a vital role in bringing financial stability and self-respect to women. However, it is crucial for self-help groups to be trained in aspects like defining goals, organisational structure and processes, market survey, management, financial planning, identifying opportunities, skill development, sales and so on. With this view, a two-day workshop on Women's Self-Help Groups and Entrepreneurship Development was organised on 17th and 18th June 2017 for the benefit of women entrepreneurs in self-help groups and of representatives and organizations working to promote self-help groups. The workshop comprised of talks on subjects like the relationship between self-help groups, self-employment and entrepreneurship, the history of self-help groups, opportunities and challenges, management and report-writing, market survey, various government schemes, advertising and marketing of a product, publicity, public relations, quality assurance and budget. The resource persons were Suvarna Gokhale, Swati Mahalank, Manish Puranik, Sarita Pathak, Prakash Bhonge, Shyam Bhurke, and Milind Sampgaonkar. A successful entrepreneur Dnyaneshwar Bodke was interviewed about his experiences, which inspired the participants. The workshop also included group discussions and group activities for the participants. 9 female and one male representative from Pune, Latur, Nanded, Aurangabad and Kolhapur districts participated in this workshop.



11.2 Workshop on Administrative and Financial Management for NGOs (24th, 25th June 2018)

This two-day Workshop was held at Amravati on 24th and 25th June 2018 in association with Janakalyan Seva Sanstha, Amravati. The workshop was inaugurated by Ghanshyam Kakraniya, President, Janakalyan Seva Sanstha and Dr. Anil Savarkar of Sant Achyut Maharaj Heart Hospital. The workshop included talks on role of trustees, vision and mission of an organisation, the importance of public relation, fund-raising, fund management, audit, accounting and corporate social responsibility. The resource persons were renowned experts like Vivek Atre, Shri. Manish Puranik, Shriram Patwardhan. A total of 58 participants, including 22 women were present. The participants represented six different organisations viz. 11.3 The Show Must Go On (15th July 2017)

A one-day training workshop titled 'The Show Must Go On' was conducted on 15th July 2017 at Patrakar Bhavan, Pune, for the members of the BJP Film Workers' Association (Maharashtra Region). The workshop aimed at developing leadership skills and teamwork skills among the office-bearers and members of the association. It included sessions on listening skills and counseling, Right to Information Act, team-building and teamwork skills, social responsibility, eco-friendly development strategies, eco-friendly lifestyle and work culture. Eminent experts invited to conduct the sessions were Dr. Anagha Lawlekar, Vivek Velankar, Sharmila Oswal, Pramod Kulkarni, Dilip Kulkarni and Shyam Bhurke.

Shyam Bhurke concluded the workshop by stating that the utility value of an organisation and its ideology gets reflected in its work culture. He also handed over the certificates to the participants. A total of 44 people from the fields of politics, social work, education and the industry hailing from Pune, Mumbai, Parbhani, Chandrapur, Sangli, Solapur, Ahmednagar, Usmanabad and Raigad districts participated in the workshop. They included officials from voluntary and educational institutions, teachers, principals, doctors, lawyers, political activists, and secretaries to MLAs, Gram Panchayat Sarpanch and college students.

11.5 Administrative Leadership Development for Students appearing for Competitive Examinations (UPSC and MPSC) (4th March 2018)

Students appearing for competitive examinations are expected to read and analyse current developments related to society, politics, the Constitution of India, social development, the economy and so on. The Administrative Leadership Development Programme was conducted on 4th March 2018 at Patrakar Bhavan, Pune, with the aim of giving aspirants a clear idea of the various subjects in the examinations and building their confidence for the interviews.

Accordingly, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe guided the 250 student aspirants of UPSC/ MPSC. He made students aware of the various welfare measures of the Government and exhorted the students to consider self-employment rather than pursuing jobs. He also encouraged them to look for new avenues for entrepreneurship. He also stressed the importance of making the administrative system efficient, transparent and functioning within the bounds of law.

11.6 Social Media for Political Activists - A Workshop (10th, 11th March 2018)

A two-day workshop on Social Media for Political Activists was organised by the Centre for Institution Building and Leadership Studies at Pune on 10th -11th March 2018. The first two sessions of the workshop were conducted by Swati Mahalank, senior journalist, comperer and author and Prof. Kshitij Patukale respectively. Bhau Torsekar guided the participants on what to write on social media and how to write it. Shailendra Mahajan spoke on planning the social media publicity policy of the party. Both the speakers shared their professional and political experiences garnered over the years. Renowned cyber-crime investigator Sandeep Gadia imparted valuable information about social media and cyber laws. The workshop also comprised practical sessions on social media, which included demonstrations by Pratik Dhatrak. The final session on how to develop a social media team for a political party was conducted by



Priti Gandhi. 47 activists of Congress, Nationalist Congress Party, Shetkari Kamgar Paksha, Shivsena, Maharashtra Navnirman Sena and Bharatiya Janata Party from Jalgaon, Sangli, Yavatmal, Buldhana, Solapur, Kolhapur, Khamgaon, Raigad, Ahmednagar, Pune, Mumbai and Thane participated in the workshop.

11.7 Shivsena, Pune City, Office-bearers Training Camp (17th March 2018)

A one-day Training Camp was organised by RMP on 17th March 2018 at Pune for 350 office-bearers and members of Shivsena. The aim of the camp was to prepare the participants for the challenges of campaigning for the 2019 elections. Shivsena MP Arvind Sawant inaugurated the programme. The first session about team-building skills was conducted by Dr. Aruna Kaulgud. Deepak Jadhav spoke on booth management and election management.

The third session on oratory skills was conducted by Ajit Joshi. He underlined the importance of punctuality and speaking to the point while addressing the public during public meetings or campaigns. He invited some participants on the stage and guided them through actual speeches of 2-3 minutes duration. The workshop was concluded with an address by Chandrakant Mokate, Pune City Chief, Shivsena.

12. RMP INTERNATIONAL

Jewish Refugees in Arab countries and their similarities with refugee communities in India-A Discussion (5th December 2017)

In order to mark the Jewish Refugees Day which falls on 30th November every year, a discussion on Jewish Refugees in Arab countries and their similarities with refugee communities in India was organised on 5th December 2017 at Chanchal Smruti, Wadala under the joint aegis of RMP International and Indo-Israel Friendship Association. The Chief Guest was Jakov Finkelstein, Consul General of Israel in Mumbai. The guest speaker, who had specially come all the way from Israel, was Zvi Gabe, retired Israeli Ambassador. Mahesh Tejwani, Trustee of Swami Vivekanand Education Trust, Chembur represented the Sindhi refugees; Entrepreneur Shakti Munshi represented the Kashmiri Pandits and senior Advocate Ramesh Mudholkar represented the Bangladeshi Hindus. The histories and issues of all these refugee groups were discussed.

When the United Nations passed its resolution on the division of Palestine into Jewish and Arab nations on 29th November 1947, around 10 lakh Jews who had been living in the Arab countries and Iran for past 2000 years were violently displaced and stripped of their homes and belongings. Mahesh Tejwani explained the unique issue of Sindhi refugees who were scattered all over India after the Partition as the entire Sindh province became part of Pakistan, unlike Punjab and Bengal which were divided. Shakti Munshi gave a heartrending account of the arrival of Islam in Kashmir,



the exploitation of Pandits, discrimination against Hindus and Buddhists in Jammu and Ladakh after the Partition, the displacement of the Pandits in 1989 due to terrorist threats, the trauma faced by the children and the aged and the false representation of victimhood by the people of Kashmir. Adv. Mudholkar described the condition of Hindu minorities in Indonesia, Malaysia and Bangladesh. The Hindus in Bangladesh had to suffer the repercussions of every India-Pakistan war as well as communal riots. He pointed out that the condition of Hindus in Bangladesh is precarious, irrespective of which government is in power. This programme had 22 participants, including researchers on international affairs.

The programme concluded on the note that all refugees face similar issues and there is a need to come together in order to create more awareness. The programme was compered by Anay Joglekar.

13. RAMBHAU MHALGI PRABODHINI, DELHI

13.1 Smart India Hackathon-2017 (1st, 2nd April 2017)

Persistent Technology, Pune, Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Government of India, AICTE and Prabodhini organised Smart India Hackathon 2017 on 1st and 2nd April 2017. Hon. Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi had appealed to the Indian youth regarding digital literacy, stating that if the progress of the nation is to be truly inclusive, the indifference and fear about technology needs to be removed from the minds of the common people. Various programmes with this aim must be held regularly. Responding to his appeal, RMP had organised the biggest Hackathon in India. On this occasion, Prime Minister Modi tweeted that proper use of digital technology and research is important in order to transform the knowledge into skills. More than a thousand students from 32 institutions all over India participated in this 36-hour non-stop software development competition.

13.2 Transforming India Dialogues Series

RMP organised number of seminars during the year with the theme Transforming India Dialogues. The series which had started last year continued this year too. The fourth seminar in this series was organised at the Deputy-Chairman Hall of the Constitution Club of India in Delhi on 28th April 2018. Dr. Jitendra Singh (MoS, DONER, PMO's Office, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Department of Atomic Energy and Department of Space) was the speaker for the seminar. 'PM Shri. Modi's Act East Policy is bringing about a complete transformation. The North-eastern states are progressing rapidly as a result of the policy', stated Dr. Singh in his address. He emphasised the need for creating nation-wide awareness about education, employment and business opportunities in the 7 North-Eastern states. 30 representatives from different educational institutions participated in the seminar.

The fifth series of Transforming India Dialogues was held on 28th June 2017 at the Deputy Chairman Hall of the Constitution Club of India in Delhi. The speaker for the fifth edition was Jayant Sinha, Minister of State for Aviation. Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe chaired the session. Sinha charted the progress achieved in the field of aviation during the Modi government. More than 70 representatives from different educational institutions participated in the seminar.

The sixth series of Transforming India Dialogues was organised on 26th July 2017 at Nehru Memorial Library, Teen Murti Bhavan in New Delhi. Sumeet Bhasin, Director of Public Policy Research Centre chaired the session. Dr. Srinivas M, Dean ESIC Medical College, Hyderabad was the speaker. There were 60 participants including dignitaries and students in the field of medicine.



The seventh seminar in the series was organised on 3rd March 2018 at the Deputy Chairman Hall of the Constitution Club of India in Delhi. Padma Shri Nouf Marwaai, Founder of Arab Yoga Foundation was the speaker. Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe chaired the session. Marwaai has made a sterling contribution in popularizing the Indian tradition of Yoga in Saudi Arabia. She has been actively working in the field of Yoga and Naturopathy for 19 years. It was because of her relentless efforts that yoga was legalized and received official recognition in Saudi Arabia. More than 50 participants were present, including researchers, social scientists, medical professionals and media persons.

13.3 Netritva Sadhana, Certificate Course in Socio-Political Leadership (6th - 10th June 2017)

Three separate training camps for leadership development were successfully organised during this year. The Netritva Sadhana-7 was held at Panchkula, Haryana from 6th to 10th June 2017. The aim of this camp is to nurture social and political leadership skills among the youth. RMP organised this camp in Haryana with a view to develop the leadership skills of the local youth. The five-day camp consisted of a total of 25 sessions. 30 youngsters participated in the camp. The themes of the sessions conducted by social and political leaders, researchers and professors included Maoism of the extreme Left, Election Management, Foreign Policy, Indian Constitution, Internal Security, Social organisations and the politics of development, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao initiative, Political Activism, Media Management, Deliberations on International Politics, Good Governance and Introduction to Social Issues. Dignitaries like Manohar Lal Khattar, Chief Minister, Haryana, Kaptan Singh Solanki, Hon. Governor of Haryana, Jagdish Chopra, President, Haryana Tourism Development Corporation, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, Ravindra Sathe, Prof. Sushma Yadav, Dr. Rajiv Nayan, Nitin Gokhale and Santosh Gupta guided the participants.

Netritva Sadhana-8 was held at Kahikuchchi, Guwahati, from 27th June to 1st July 2017. This certificate course was inaugurated by, Hon. Sarbananda Sonowal, Chief Minister of Assam. Ravindra Sathe was present for the occasion. The valedictory session was chaired by Hon. Banwarilal Purohit, Governor of Assam. The resource persons included Indrani Tahbildar, Rajiv Nayan, Santosh Gupta, Dr. Hitesh Bajpai, Ravi Pokharna and Mukund Bihari. 30 young participants, including students who are active in politics, completed the course.

New India Vision 2020 (15th - 17th September 2017) - RMP organised New India Vision 2020 training camp from 15th to 17th September 2017 at Port Blair, Andaman. In this three-day residential event, past Netritva Sadhana participant from various states from the education and political sectors participated in the eight sessions, 30 individuals were part of this training. In this training camp Education, Health, Communication, Information & Communication, Technology, Production, Infrastructure facilities, Natural habitat, Nature, Energy, Water, Food & Farming, Medical Science, Healthcare topics and their relation to the subjects of Poverty, Corruption, Casteism, Sectarianism, Terrorism, Uncleanliness was explained.

This training camp was inaugurated by Governor of Andaman-Nicobar Dr. Jagdish Mukhi. Ravindra Sathe was also present at this training camp. Dr. Vinay Sahasdrabudhe also joined this camp via Video Conference, he gave his expert guidance on the training camp and conveyed his best wishes. Patricia Mukhim, Shillong Times, Hon. 14. INDIAN INSTITUTE OF DEMOCRATIC LEADERSHIP (IIDL)

During this year, RMP has started a postgraduate programme based on the three principles of Leadership, Politics and Good Governance under the aegis of the Indian Institute of Democratic Leadership (IIDL). This 9-month programme is designed to fulfil the need for skilled, studious and efficient human resources for political leadership, good governance and social development.

Unique features of the course - This postgraduate course conducted by the IIDL has become a link between the intellectual youth of India, Indian democratic principles and the need for good governance. The course has been designed keeping in mind young students and professionals aspiring for a career in politics and governance. The resource persons for the course comprises of educationists, experts, policy makers, elected representatives, politicians, administrators, journalists and activists. The students get valuable practical inputs from experts who have actually been working in these fields. The course stresses on field trips and study tours in addition to lectures in order to provide well-rounded training. The course also includes a one-month internship to be undertaken at the end of the programme.

Target participants - Students and young professionals desirous of a career in journalism, politics, governance, and social work can participate in the course.

First batch - The training of the first batch of the postgraduate course by the IIDL began on 7th August 2017. A total of 32 students from 14 different states of India participated in the course. The inaugural session of the course was attended by Arnab Goswami, Chief Editor, Republic TV, Shekhar Sen, President, Sangeet Natak Academy and Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe. Ravindra Sathe, Dean, IIDL, administered the specially prepared oath to the participants of the course. Rekha Mahajan and Arvind Rege, Members of the Managing Committee of RMP were present for the programme.

During the course, participants were addressed by a number of renowned researchers and subject experts from the fields of politics, governance and social work. They attended lectures and participated in interactions with various luminaries including Amit Shah, Lal Krishna Advani, Nitin Gadkari, Smriti Irani; Dr Mahesh Sharma, Jitendra Singh, Jayram Ramesh, Harivansh Narayan Singh; Gopal Shetty, Meenakshi Lekhi, Poonam Mahajan, Amar Sable, Nimrod Assouline (Deputy Consul General, Israel Consulate), Radhakrishnan Pillai (author), Jay Mrug (Expert public opinion analyst) Prof. Dr. Ashok Modak and Shailesh Gandhi.

The students got the opportunity to benefit from internships at the war room during Karnataka Elections, Kurud constituency of Chhatisgarh, Public Policy Research Centre, New Delhi, office of Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe as well as Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha, Gujarat.

IIDL partnered with Vivekananda Education Society's Institute of Management for their literature festival - VESIM Literati Festival as "institutional partner". The two day literature festival saw participation of over 40 speakers/authors across various fields and was attended by nearly 400 participants.

IIDL students organised an exhibition on the history of electoral reforms in India and best global electoral practices during the national convention on "One Nation, One Election." The exhibition was inaugurated by Shri Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairperson, NITI Aayog.
